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## BULLYING AWARENESS

## Consider the following:

a. A seventh grader with dyslexia has a hard time decoding words when reading. Which results in giggling and name calling whenever he is called upon to read aloud or write on the board in class. The teasing is often carried over into other settings, like the cafeteria and hallway between classes.
b. An eighth grader with a learning disability and ADHD is always the last to be chosen by peers for group projects. She is enthusiastic, creative, and knows a lot about the subject, but her peers dislike her disorganized approach to work and her need for modeling and structure when working on assignments.
